his city friends and where he chose to raise his children. Dominick had a street-smart

survival attitude mixed with a deep faith from his catholic background that

gave him a very unique, lifestyle.

As Dominick grew and matured, he

began focusing more on his faith and service to others. He lived in a Jesuit

priest's community for a few years and spent many years working in a hospital

where he brought joy and hope to people in crisis. He consistently preached

that we are here to serve and have gratitude and would want this last moment to remind us of that.

Dominick was very proud of his

family and loved attending his children's and grandchildren's sporting events

and emphasized academics to his children since he didn't have that opportunity

in life. He also enjoyed taking family vacations every year to

Spirit Lake as

he loved to fish and be with his family. He was known for being able to strike

up a conversation and make friends with anyone and was always showing people a good time.

Dominick had the first successfully

performed open heart surgery in Omaha on his 13th birthday which

gave him the opportunity to live a full and colorful life and at 75 his heart

gave out, but he will always remain in the hearts of those he touched from his

mentoring and countless acts of joy and service. He was truly a special person,

and the world won't be the same without him.
